Light and tiny, these seeds are bona fide conquistadors. The air is their ally: a simple puff is enough to carry them off to new countries they can colonize. Wearing a petticoat, a plume, or a parachute, the numerous representatives of this miniature society are full of tricks!

1. ARTICHOKE

Cynara cardunculus • x 4

You eat the base of the artichoke flower before it sets seed.

2. CLEMATIS

Clematis flammula • x 4

Its delicate plume is used as a sail as it meanders about the countryside.

3. PLANE TREE

Platanus acerifolia • x 4,5

Pranksters know that its hairy seed is an awesome itching powder.

4. ST. JOHN'S WORT

Hypericum sp. • x 43

Smaller than a grain of sand, this seed takes advantage of the slightest breeze.

5. STAR CLOVER

Trifolium stellatum • x 20

Elegant and graceful, the seed dances like a ballerina on the wind.

6. WHITE CAMPION

Silene latifolia • x 27

This feral night owl is so discreet that its dispersal often goes unnoticed.
